On behalf of Te Hau Ora Ō Ngāpuhi Directors and kaimahi, I am pleased to report on the last 12 months' activities.

Our purpose at Te Hau Ora Ō Ngāpuhi is 'to provide a healthy and safe community for whānau to thrive in'.

Improving the health of Ngāpuhi and contributing to improved health outcomes in our community is our priority. It is important that we understand the health needs and desires of whānau. With this intent, the collating of this information means leadership has had to be respectful, tune in and listen more to what whānau are saying. Obtaining information has been critical so our service planning and prioritisation is whānau driven and reflects the needs of the community.

For the last 12 months, Te Hau Ora Ō Ngāpuhi has been committed to the organisation's purpose by focussing on developing the organisation's capabilities in the following areas:

- Connectivity & Accessibility
- Development of e-Ngākau app
- Implementation of iMoko at all of our primary schools
- Availability to quality healthcare
- Affordable GP services
- Success is succession – training people to be better than yourself
- Adapting to changes in our community in order to respond to whānau needs
- Sustaining current services and programmes
- Increase in resources for whānau.

Te Hau Ora Ō Ngāpuhi has influenced change through:

- Courageous leadership by Directors to build the capability of Te Hau Ora Ō Ngāpuhi
- Building and growing the workforce by investing in their academic learning and development.
- Fostering 'success is succession' and building effective, collaborative teams
- Advocating a shift in emphasis from illness to wellness
- Focusing on early intervention and prevention
- Working with unnatural partners in the design of services to whānau
- More local collective discussion, planning and shared decision making.

The priority health areas for early invention among Ngāpuhi communities are to:

- Increase the understanding of health and well-being by health coaching, support and interventions to enable and empower whānau
- Working closely with community partners who focus on physical activity, healthy eating and nutrition, vaccinations and immunisation.

The key areas affecting our whānau are:

- Increased respiratory disease, infectious disease due to sub-standard, cold and damp housing
- Children being uplifted from their homes as they are being neglected, they are not being clothed, fed and loved
- Methamphetamine addiction
- Whānau violence
- Cancer, Cardiovascular disease and Diabetes.
